
# OLD PANAMA AND THE CANAL ZONE





## THE FAIRYLAND OF BERMUDA



# VERA CRUZ

Vera Cruz is one of the oldest, quaintest, yet most cosmopolitan of the Mexican coast towns —an odd blend of the antique and the modern-Fine new buildings stand side by side with diminutive negrocabins. In the broad Campeche Bay you may see ships of all maritime nations, for Vera Cruz is the gateway for the majority of exports and imports of Mexico.

## MEXICO CITY

The route from Vera Ceux to Mexico City is one of the most scenic in the world, and from the train, as it climbs from sea level to over 7,000 feet, will be seen cloud capped mountains, tremendous gorges, towering cliffs, roaring waterfalls and as the train nears the summit, we will see 2,000 feet below the village of Maltrata Jooking like a chess board.

This railroad is undoubtedly one of the marvels of engineering, between Cordoba to Boca del Monte, the train climbs over 5,000 feet in less than 42 miles.

Mexico Ciry will astonish the visitor with its many places of interest, including The National Museum, which possesses more genuine and authentic relies of primitive America than any other muceum on the Continent. The National Library, The National Palace, The Cathodral, The National Authentic and Carlos Carl

thedral, The National Theatre.

Along the wonderful boulevards will be found many shops where the shopper will find Mexican curios, drawn linents, hand carved leather, Azree feather work, etc.

In Mexico City is the famous Chapultepec

Park. At the top of Chapultepee Hill is the famous Chapultepee Castle, the official home of the President of Mexico. From the eastle can be seen the great snow-capped peaks of Popocarencel and Ixaccibuath.

A short distance from Mexico City will be found the Pyramids of San Juan Teotihuacan. Here will be found a museum housing many relics of pre-historic days which have been unearthed during excavations in the last eight.

Surrounding the Pyramid, is a variety of landings and platforms which form the "court of the Pyramid of the Sun," and nearby is the Pyramid of the Moon and the Temple of Xochimiloo, which is about fifteen miles from the city and known as the Floating Garden, is a most wonderful sight. Here are grown a large variety of flowers for the markers of Mexico City. Xochimiloo derives its name of Floating Garden because of its many canals, which are fed by natural springs.

# LOVELY NASSAU

Reservations and tickets for these various excursions can be obtained from the Cruise Director on board and a complete outline of the program is given in a separate folder.

We, however, give below a short outline of the various excursions which will be offered in connection with the four cruises.

## HAVANA-A Combined Ciry and Country trip

In order to give our passengers an opportunity of seeing Havana at night, we have arranged an excursion to leave the steamer after dinner at about 8 P.M., visiting the Chinese Quarters, witness an exhibition of the famous Spanish national game—the "Jai-Alai," and a visit to the "Gran Casino" (Cuba's Monte Carlo), etc.

## VERA CRUZ-for Mexico City

Passengers proceed to Mexico City from Vera Cruz by special train, which will be awaiting the steamer at the Terminal Wharf. The program will include the following: A visit to Xochimilco, some fifteen miles south of the city, often upoken of as the Floating Gardens. Here are a number of islands intersected by wasterways, where quantities of flowers and vegetables for the Mexico City market are grown.

On the way to Xochimileo opportunity will be afforded to visit the Convent of Churubauco, closely identified with the campaign of the United States forces under General Scott in 1848. On the way the party will pass the Mexico City Country Club.

Luncheon will be served at the Chapultepes Cafe, located in the beautiful grounds of Chapultepec Park, one of the beauty spots of the world and in romantic charm,

After Juncheon the parry will visit the Cautle of Cha-puletpec, which was begun in 1783 and is now one of the residences of the President of the Mexican Republic. The visitors will also see here the Don Quinoue Fountain, a most pleasing work of modern art.

If time permits other points of interest will be visited, such as the National Museum, which possesses more genuine saniques and suthentic relies of primitive America than any other Museum, also the National Library and the famous Cathedral.

On the return trip the train will stop at Teotihuacias, affording an opportunity to visit the famous Pyramids of the Sun and Moon and the Temple of Questafoast, stupendous remains of the Toltec and Arec civilizations. On recuming the journey towards Vera Crut, the train will, within a short distance, drop from an elevation of over 8, 100 feet, to sea level.

## COLON (PANAMA CANAL)-Across the Isthmus to Panama

From Cristobal the passengers go by special train to Gambon, stopping on route for a visit of the Gatun Locks and Dam.
